Your digital Working with Children Check (card)

All Lions (and Friends of Lions) are required to have a current WWCC. The new policy is in the members section of our Club website. If yours is not current, please take action now. Did you know you can get a digital WWCC – and keep it in your Service Victoria wallet on your mobile phone? Then you will have it available, without needing to carry a physical card.

You'll need the Service Victoria App on your phone, and a current Service Victoria account. You'll also need a current (unexpired) WWCC. If you need some assistance – reach out.



Need a new shirt, sleeveless vest or something warmer with sleeves for winter?

As part of the 2024/25 membership renewal – the Club is offering to reimburse up to \$38.50 to all Lions for a new/second shirt, sleeveless vest or long-sleeved vest/hoodie – embroidered with the Lions logo and Torquay – up to \$38.50. Victoria's container deposit scheme (money back on drink cans and bottles - 10 cents each one)



Have you worked out how to 'deposit' your drink containers, and get some money back?

If you just want a voucher (at Torquay North, for Woolworths), you just turn up and follow the instructions.

But . . . if you want money in your bank account or (even better!) to donate to a registered 'partner' (including **Torquay Lions Club**) you will presently need to download the 'CDS Vic West' App from the App Store or Google store (depending on your mobile device).

It's easy, and if you need a hand just ask a grandchild or a Lion who knows about these things! You will need to select 'Torquay Lions Cash for Community' as your default organisation, and then you just open the App and scan the barcode when you deposit your cans and bottles. It really is easy.

Some have said that Lions support the community 'one sausage at a time'. With CDS – we can equally support the community 'one can or bottle at a time'. So – drink more; save the containers until you have a few, and donate the collected 10c to Lions.
