Thank you to Tony who has been our Safety Officer for a while now. Tony has decided that there is an opportunity for someone else to step in to this role in the New Year. It's not a difficult role – and we do need someone to remind us every now and then of risks, and to arrange for safety 'stuff' to happen. Who's up for that role for the next 7 months?

Thanks to Brian for arranging a recent inspection of our BBQ trailer – including things like checking the fire extinguisher is 'in date', that we have the right safety information displayed, the hot water works etc. If you didn't get the chance to get a guided tour of the BBQ trailer to understand how it is safely set up and operated, (and if you are not sure what's in these photos!) – please just ask and we will give you a personal 'guided tour' (probably as you help set up for a BBQ!)



And while on BBQs and safety – a reminder about hand hygiene. It's a requirement that – unless we are doing the money or cooking the sausages – we wear gloves (because these other jobs involve handling food). And if you need to – sanitise the gloves using hand-sanitiser. This all goes to our reputation as Lions – with the council, those hosting us, and the public – and compliance with our Streatrader Statement of Trade and Regs.

Lions' five global causes

Did you know - Lions Clubs International (LCI) has five global causes:

- **Diabetes** We serve to reduce the prevalence of diabetes and improve quality of life for those diagnosed.
- **Vision** We serve to prevent avoidable blindness and improve quality of life for people who are blind and visually impaired.
- Hunger We serve to ensure all community members have access to nutritious foods.
- **Environment** We serve to sustainably protect and restore our environment to improve the well-being of all communities.
- **Childhood Cancer** Lions and Leos provide support for the needs of children and families affected by childhood cancer through impactful service activities.

We aim to have a number of activities this year that involve the community and highlight these global causes.

'Lap the Map for Diabetes' (or should that be 'against' diabetes!) involved the community and created awareness – on 13 November (the day before World Diabetes Day – 14 November). Thanks to Neil, Ross and team for their work in organising. This also raised nearly \$300 for diabetes research and awareness.

A substantial part of our income is now through our 'Square' reader (effectively straight in to our bank account) rather than cash sales. This includes BBQs, the train, pub raffles, caravan park raffles and cake sales. And there's no going back.

The bad news – we don't have enough Lions able to independently use the equipment.

The good news – now we have the 'dongle' it really is quite straight forward. Long gone are the days of fighting to connect the iPad to the internet through someone's phone!

We recognise – there are a few Lions who will not be able to manage this aspect. We understand. But it would be great if we could get at least 20 Lions (plus a few more from friends and family) to the stage where you feel comfortable 'doing the money'. This will make rostering much easier and allow some Lions, who now need a more sedentary job, to continue to play an active part in the club's activities.

So . . . if you get a phone call asking you to help and offering to train you – PLEASE say 'yes' before you think about it! Our promise is that we will not just 'dump you in to the deep end of the pool' – we will take things slowly and be right by your side until you feel comfortable.
