Lions Service award presentations

Theo Reyntjes - 15 years

Joined in October 2005 and so has reached 15 years of service with Lions.

Theo was President in 2008-9 and 2012-13.

He remains an active member and is our key person to organise working bees.

Allen Osman - 30 years

Joined in Torquay at the end of 1992, which is just short of 30 years. But as you know, he was an undercover cop, and with Lions, he was also undercover as a member at the Lions Club of Melton before transferring to Torquay. He has reached 30 years of service.

Allen was President in 2016-17 and has been a Vice President several times.

He was a James D Richardson award recipient in 2019 Allen is an active member and exemplifies what it means to be a Lion.

Harvey Price - 40 years

Joined in October 1980, and has now reached 40 years of service.

We held a celebration of Harvey's years in Lions at our recent Zoom meeting.

He was President in 1984-85 and again in 1995-96.

He has been Treasurer 5 times, including the last Lions year. He has been LCIF Coordinator on 4 occasions.

He was awarded Melvin Jones Fellowship in 1993. And he was awarded a James D Richardson in 2011.

Alan Young - 45 years

Joined in July 1975, reaching 45 years of service. He was President in 1992-3.

He received an Alan Holding award in 1998, and Melvin Jones Fellowship in 2001 and received a 40-year Monarch letter signed by the International President in 2015. Although in his nineties, he is a regular on this new-fangled thing called Zoom.

Robert Grubb – 50 years

Robert Grubb joined the Lions Club of Ballarat on September 9th, 1970. We also held a celebration of Rob's 50 years of service in Lions at a recent Zoom meeting.

The Melvin Jones Fellowship Award is the highest recognition from the Lions Club International Foundation, being given to members who have rendered outstanding community services.
