6 Train and BBQ Trailer Checks.

The train trailer has been checked for structural stability and found to be sound. The gas fitting on the BBQ trailer have been checked and the flexible hoses to the BBQ plates are to be replaced. For future reference there are new rules coming in soon that all gas fittings on trailers will need to be checked every 5 years.

7 BBQ Equipment.

There are now two separate boxes of tools etc in the Lions Shed for BBQs. One is for use with our Trailer. The other is for Bunnings BBQs. The tools etc provided by Bunnings are not to be used as there is often confusion at the end of the last shift as to who owns what!

8 Shelter at Bunnings BBQs.

There is insufficient shelter provided by the current setup at Bunnings for both volunteers and customers in inclement weather. Ross Yapp is to speak to Molly at Bunnings about this.

9 Cowrie Market Photo Opportunity.
